What is Digital Equity?

Digital equity is about raising awareness that not everyone in our community has the same opportunities for access to technology, the internet, digital skills and digital content needed to connect and be safe online.

What is Digital Inclusion?

Digital inclusion is about having equitable access to affordable digital technology and the internet and knowing how to use a technology for day-to-day activities. As a community, we can support digital equity for all by providing and advocating for:


DIGITAL SKILLS & SUPPORT: Access to help with learning how to use a device and be safe online

Access to the Internet

Need Help With Affordable Access To The Internet? Telus has programs for people on a low income and need support connecting. Each program has an eligibility requirement:

TELUS MOBILITY FOR GOOD

Provides eligible youth aging out of foster care and low-income seniors with a subsidized cell phone and data plan. There are also Mobility for Good programs for Indigenous Women at Risk and Government Assisted Refugees.

TELUS INTERNET FOR GOOD PROGRAMS

Connect eligible families in need, youth aging out of care, people with disabilities and low-income seniors with low-cost internet.


